**Where:** Dick and Marti Ruben's home, 345 Old York Road, New Cumberland 717-938-2922


**Cost:** For \$5.00 your beverages and ox are covered.

- S-Z - Snacks



## Trip Deposit Deadlines


*Stowe Deposit Deadline Nov 1!*




### Nissley Wine Tour, Taste, Picnic & Dance


