The original rail bed dates back to 1883 when Robert Coleman built the Cornwall-Lebanon Railroad to connect the Pennsylvania Railroad in Elizabethtown with Lebanon's Reading Railroad. The rail line was used until 1972 when Hurricane Agnes washed out long sections of the track. Presently, the trail is sustained by both Lancaster and Lebanon counties.
