Two No-Risk Trips Still Available:

1. Crystal Lake -Gem of Pennsylvania

There is still lots of space on the Crystal Lake Trip. It will occur on the weekend of January 25-27, 2008 (2 nights). Even if you are unfamiliar with Crystal Lake, go and we'll bet that you will agree with Dave LeRoy that it is the best XC Ski Center in Pennsylvania and maybe the Northeast. The trails wind through the woods and around 3 lakes. And they vary from very easy to really advanced with lots of them in between. Many of us like the idea of skiing right out the door - no driving all weekend! Now about snow -Crystal Lake is much more likely

to have snow - good snow - than Harrisburg. But if there is no snow at Crystal Lake 48 hours prior to the trip, your trip payment will be refunded in full. We know many Kick 'n Gliders enjoy skiing there on day trips, but its lots more fun when you can see the sunrise and sunset and ski whenever you want in those beautiful wooded surroundings. We cook our own meals in a modern, winterized cabin and sleep in bunkrooms. Driving time is only 2 hours from Camp Hill. The cost is \$100 (deposit is \$75). With the no snow - no pay policy, you have nothing to lose. So send your deposit to PO Box 1353, Mechanicsburg, PA 17055. Trip Leader is the vivacious Carolyn Hoffman (717-432-5191).

2. Laurel HighlandsSkiing Close to Home

Right in the snow belt of Pennsylvania, Laurel Highlands is another great deal with many skiing venues that include Forbes State Forest, as well as Laurel Ridge and Kooser State Parks. Laurel Ridge has a warming hut, concessions, and groomed trails for all levels of skiers in a lovely forest setting. Forbes and Kooser offer opportunities for backcountry skiing. And there is downhill skiing nearby. Only a few hours from Harrisburg, this trip is very flexible, since Dennis Major, trip leader, made arrangements at the Holiday Inn in Somerset for rooms that can be cancelled up to 6 PM the day of arrival, just in case the snow doesn't cooperate. The cost of the room, \$206, can be shared, so it is also reasonable.

What could be better than great cross-country skiing without the 7-hour drive to the North? So check your calendars and sign up for Crystal Lake and Laurel Highlands. Enjoy skiing close to home.

These guidelines were prepared with the hope of making the swap meet fun and giving those who wish to rotate/sell their gear an opportunity to do so.

As this being our first swap meet, we look forward to feedback.

Please share your suggestions and ideas. Let an executive board member know if the program is worth repeating.

<u>Guidelines</u>

- Responsibility for each transaction rests totally between the buyer and the seller.
- 2. All sellers must be members of the Kick and Gliders.

- 3. Kick and Gliders, its officers and members, and Wildware, its owners and employes, bear no responsibility for any transaction in whole or part.
- All sale items must be directly related to any sport requiring the user to move without the aid of a motor or for camping.
- 5. Sellers are limited to a maximum of 7 items. If there is space available after everybody wishing to sell something has displayed their items, a seller may bring additional items or larger items inside to display. (As this is our first swap meet, we have no idea what to expect.)
- Bulky items, large items or items in excess of the 7 maximum should remain in a vehicle. Pictures and/or descriptions may be displayed at the swap meet.
- 7. Sellers must note all rips, dents, dings, defects, scratches and imperfections in the item being sold.
- All items displayed inside must be clearly marked with asking prices and sellers' names.
- 9. All sale items must be clean and ready for use.
