Swap Meet Guidelines

1. Responsibility for each transaction rests totally between the buyer and the seller.
2. All sellers must be members of the Kick and Gliders.
3. Kick and Gliders, its officers and members, and Wildware, its owners and employees, bear no responsibility for any transaction in whole or part.
4. All sale items must be directly related to any sport requiring the user to move without the aid of a motor or for camping.
5. Sellers are limited to a maximum of 7 items. If there is space available after everybody wishing to sell something has displayed their items, a seller may bring additional items or larger items inside to display. (As this is our first swap meet, we have no idea what to expect.)
6. Bulky items, large items or items in excess of the 7 maximum should remain in a vehicle. Pictures and/or descriptions may be displayed at the swap meet.
7. Sellers must note all rips, dents, dings, defects, scratches and imperfections in the item being sold.
8. All items displayed inside must be clearly marked with asking prices and sellers' names.
9. All sale items must be clean and ready for use. The room is small. Please cooperatively use the space.

Report on Trail Clearing Work Party at Crystal Lake, November 17

I was doubting my own sanity a bit for departing at 6:45 a.m. for a 2 ¼ hour drive to Crystal Lake, knowing that there would be: 1) no snow; 2) cloudy, cold, windy weather predicted; and 3) hours of manual labor ahead. Heck, my own shrubs need pruning, garden needs mulching and oh yeah, what about Christmas shopping and that big Penn State vs. Michigan game this afternoon?

At the top of the mountain, there was a fresh dusting of snow on the trees. Upon pulling up to the CLC ski shop, about 8 other familiar ski enthusiasts were suiting up for work in the woods and gabbing about plans for trips, new skis, new ski rails and how neat they will be. YES, XC Season has returned!

The main job of the work party was to prune back the mountain laurel and brush that had grown to drape over the up-hill banks narrowing the ski trails and secondly to remove rocks that are loose and sticking up in the trail. My detachment cleared most of Birchview trail (west of the lake). The other group cleared Sunset trail and a new glade area beyond

Boardpile. Pruning loppers and pole chain saws were the tools of choice.

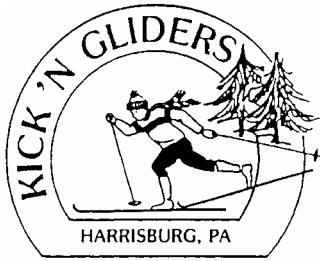
Shortly after we started to work, the coats came off as it was plenty warm with virtually no wind. It was easy to converse while we worked and I was able to have some good exchanges with John Manifold (the current caretaker and past designer of the CLC trail system) regarding future plans and recent developments at CLC. John has ordered a bigger/better grooming rig and upgrades to the Polaris snow cat to pull the groomer better. He has plans in his head for new trails out beyond Birchview and Whipple Mill. While discussing XC ski history, he touched on long-ago ski trips down to White Grass skiing with Chip Chase, explaining the origin of the area's name (your suspicions are confirmed).

Anna provided a hearty and tasty lunch served in the new Napavi cabin. We went out for another 2 ½ hour session on the trails. On the return to the ski shop, it was gratifying to see how much we had accomplished on the trails targeted for the day. We really only made a small dent in a huge undertaking...many more hands helping would have been nice.

In summary, it was a pleasant day in the woods combined with some good camaraderie resulting in a sense of accomplishment and satisfaction in understanding more closely how things work at CLC. Penn State lost anyway so maybe I didn't miss too much and got a good workout instead. I feel that we can't take CLC for granted these days as it seems to be in a tenuous state of solvency combined with uncertain organizational ownership and direction...they flat out need all the help they can get. There will be a second "official" work party on December 9th. Everyone is invited and welcome to join.
